
Entries are due January 5, 2018. I will have entry forms available beginning with the September guild meeting and the entry form will also be available on the CPQ website for download after that meeting.

Darla Hennessee Hall began her quilting interest by helping her mother and grandmother hand quilt at age 8. She was surrounded by sewists and quilters at a very early age and a 4th generation quilter. Her first machine was purchased by her parents when she graduated from Delano High School.

She considers herself "A Very Eclectic Quilter" and has experimented with many styles including Modern Quilting.

She purchased an A1 Elite longarm machine in 2005, and the rest is history. Her longarm work is heavily influenced by modern longarmers such as Karen McTavish, Angela Walters and Karlee Porter.

Many of her quilts, and client quilts, have been shown in shows including Quiltcon West 2016 and earned over 40 ribbons, (4 Best of Show) in the Antelope Valley Quilt Guild, Antelope Valley Fair, and Best of the Valley.

She has served on the board for Antelope Valley Quilt Guild and is currently serving on the board for Cotton Patch Quilters as Board Secretary and the evening meeting leader.
