


"Thoroughly Modern Dresden"

Fiber artist Anelie Belden began her sewing career working in the fashion industry which gave her the skills to begin her quilting journey. After owning her own quilt store and teaching quilting in her area she began designing quilts. She has taken the traditional Dresden Quilt design and created a new updated Dresden Designs which are featured in her book titled "Thoroughly Modern Dresden." Not only are the designs modern, they are constructed using a breakthrough piecing technique to improve speed and accuracy. Belden has recorded a program demonstrating her technique with "The Quilt Show," starring Alex Anderson and Ricky Tims.

She has also taught at Quilt Guilds throughout the country, Houston Quilt Festival and Empty Spools Seminars in Asilomar, California. An accomplished quilter, she had her quilt "Amazon Horizons" featured in the 2012 "The Art of The Quilt" Calendar published by Orange Circle Studio. Her designs have been featured in Quiltmaker Magazine.

"Bonnie K. Hunter is passionate about quilt quilting, focusing mainly on scrap quilts with the simple feeling of "making do." She started her love affair with quilting in a home economics class her senior year of high school in 1980 and has never looked back. Before quilting because her full-time career, Bonnie was the owner and designer of Needle in a Haystack!! Creating more than 70 patterns for dolls and stuffed animals with a country primitive feel.

Many of her designs were licensed through the Butterick Pattern Company, translated into 7 languages and sold around the globe through fabric stores. But quilting has always been Bonnie's first love. She has been machine quilting since 1989 and professionally long arm quilting for the public since 1995, retiring in 2009 when she no longer had the time due to her teaching, traveling and writing schedule. She has been featured in magazines both for her quilt patterns and articles she has written on scrap management and using that stash to its full potential.

Dedicated to continuing the traditions of quilting, Bonnie enjoys meeting with quilters, teaching workshops and lecturing to quilt guilds all over the world, challenging quilters to break the rules, think outside the box, and find what brings them joy. When not traveling and teaching, she spends her time piecing scrap quilts, enjoying the peaceful reward of English paper piecing and hand quilting as much as machine work, and loving life in her wooded surroundings in beautiful rural Wallburg, North Carolina, a suburb of Winston-Salem. She and her husband, Dave are the proud parents of two grown sons, Jason, and Jeffrey. They round out their household with Sadie the dog and two cats – Emmy Lou, who loves life inside only, an Chloe who only loves life on the outside—keeping Bonnie company while she designs, quilts and plays happily with her fabric.

Bonnie also writes a regular column for Quiltmaker Magazine entitled "Addicted to Scraps" with the main intention to help you to put various aspects of your own Scrap Users System to good use!

<u>A Special Note about the Bylaw</u> <u>Changes</u>

Due to the format of the Newsletter, the Bylaws will be listed **above February 2018** tab under "Newsletters" on the CPQ Guild website.

From the Parliamentarian:

You will notice the tab above the February newsletter this month which are proposed Bylaw changes. Never give the job of reviewing the Bylaws to an Ex-English teacher!

Many of the changes are merely making the Bylaws grammatically correct, as well as making them visually correct (some formatting issues). But there are some significant changes, including adding four director positions to the Executive Board. These positions will help the Guild run more smoothly, hopefully give more support to our committee chairs, and involve more people in the operations of the Guild. One of the four new director positions is the Quilt Show Chairman. We think this is such an important job that that person should have been a member of the Executive Board all along.

Also, we are suggesting a \$5.00 increase in dues, which will help us cover the costs of Electronic Funds Transfers. As many of you know until recently we have not been able to take credit card payments, but beginning with the Quilt Show, we will now be able to accept credit card payments for dues, classes, admission to special events, etc.

Please read over the Bylaw changes carefully, we will be voting on these changes at the February meeting. Any deletions to the old Bylaws will have a strikethrough, and any additions will be in red. If you have any questions you can direct them to myself, Darla Hall, or Dee Glinzak.

Update for Judged and Display Only Quilts!

In a few short days our 2018 CPQ Quilt Show will open to the Public! This display of **YOUR** quilts is guaranteed to please!

Important dates & useful information:

- ✓ Tuesday, February 6, 11 am 2 pm. Drop off ALL (judged and display only) quilts to the Event Center at Thimble Towne, 2841 Unicorn Rd., Bakersfield.
- ✓ Wednesday, February 7, 8:30 am whenever judging is complete. Quilt Judge - Linda Rasmussen.
- ✓ All entered quilts must have a 4" sleeve; quilts under 40" can have a smaller sleeve.
 Quilts over 80" must have a split sleeve.
- ✓ Quilts should be folded with the label showing and your name should be taped over.
- Please be prepared to take any protective coverings (pillowcases, plastic bags, etc.) back with you.
- ✓ Make sure your quilts are clean and free of any markings, loose strings, pet hair, lint, etc.
- ✓ Quilt Release will be 5:30 pm on Saturday, February 10.

The excitement is building! I hope you have all volunteered to work in some capacity during the Quilt Show. Together we will make it the best one yet!
