You can make a difference!

At the September meeting, we collected 30 pet beds. Our total count for the 2017 year is 207. I am soooooo excited! We have exceeded our 2017 goal! You quilters are amazing. Keep up the good work.

Pet beds can be any size or shape from eighteen inches square for cats and puppies; up to five feet square for large dogs. They can be sewn with cotton, flannel or fleece material. Use either cotton or polyester batting.

The pillowcase is a purr-fect size!

Please come by our table at the next CPQ meeting. We will have some candy at our table to share with you and while you are there; pick up a few more pet bed kits to take home and practice your quilting skills.
