CPQ Night Meeting

Dear Guild members:

It is with a sad heart that I announce the passing of a CPQ tradition....the night meeting. CPQ is one of the few (maybe the only) guilds that support a day and a night meeting. When I first joined the guild some 10 years ago, I was working and was grateful for the chance to attend a night meeting. However, 10 years ago there were 60+ members attending the night meeting.

Over the last 3-4 years, attendance at the night meeting has been steadily declining. In June of this year, a 5 member committee was formed to discuss possible changes to the night meeting. We reviewed the night meeting attendance for the fiscal year 2014-2015 and found that from July 2014 to June 2015, the average attendance was 11 members.

The committee compiled a list of options and presented them at the night meetings. Our goal was to engage the members who regularly attend the night meeting, requesting input/suggestions from them as any changes would directly affect them. Group discussions were held at two night meetings. Some of the options discussed were:

- 1) Continue night meetings with only 2 speakers. Cost to the guild = \$2,085
- 2) Continue night meetings with no speakers. Cost to the guild = \$1,485
- 3) Discontinue night meetings. No cost. Savings = \$3,200

During our discussions, most members said that they only attend if there is a speaker. If we limited the night meeting to 2 speakers, they would only attend those two meetings.

At the November board meeting, our committee made the recommendation that we discontinue the night meeting as of January 1, 2016, on the basis that the attendance does not support the cost, both financial and personal labor on the part of officers and committee chairs who have to be at both meetings. This recommendation was accepted and a motion was passed to approve.

This was NOT an easy decision on all levels. Our guild began as a night meeting, then added a day meeting. During the last 10 years, the morning meeting became an afternoon meeting and we have experienced several different meeting venues. The cost for our speakers continues to increase and, as a guild, it is our mission and goal to provide a variety of the best programs for our members to learn from and enjoy. The decision to discontinue the night meeting will help to secure the financial health of our guild for current and future members.


Dead line to sign up and list all projects is **December 31, 2015.**

Bring your friends...everyone welcome on this bus of fun!


