Fiber artist, designer, quilter, and author, Grace J. Errea, began quilting in 2000. Her art focuses on the depiction of inspiring scenes in a value based contemporary-realistic manner. She feels very fortunate to have many of her first quilts become exhibited in juried shows and be recognized for their innovation in technique and depiction of nature and people.

In 2005 she chose to retire from a successful career as an executive in a Fortune 500 computer and telecommunications company to devote herself to her art on a full-time basis. Grace is a self-taught artist and her work illustrates and has been recognized for exceptional primary use of values and secondary use of color. Her focus on value makes it easy for her and her students to create inspiring botanicals, landscape scenes and portraits, in any color.

Grace's innovative techniques and her focus on value have attracted widespread interest from quilters, as well as national and international galleries, museums and publications. She has been invited to show her art and to teach overseas and in various locations in the US.

Her style is informative, humorous and inspiring with many real-time, hands-on examples. The aim is to inspire, develop and find that artist within each student or listener.

Grace currently resides, quilts, and teaches in Southern California. She and her husband have two daughters, Julia and Lauren and two cats, Thelma and Louise.

The Fiesta Challenge quilts must be turned in no later than the October 2015 Guild meeting. Nancy Rink will be judging these quilts. I still have a couple of the fabric bundles from Thimble Towne left if you are still interested in creating something special for this challenge. The bundles are \$5.00 each and a piece of each of the five colors must be included in the quilt. The size is to be no larger than 36" on any side.

The Heart Beats Challenge quilts are due no later than the November 2015 Guild meeting. These quilts must measure 32" square and have a heart some place on them. These you will create with your own fabric and then the quilt will be donated to Loving Hands after our quilt show in February (remember - all cotton - fabric, batting and thread). The hearts do not have to be just pink or red - don't forget about the boys!


A continued thank you goes out to the businesses for their donations to our monthly raffle.



The very first quilt class I took was when Sharon Schamber came to our Quilt Guild and taught her turned edge machine appliqué method. I was hooked!

In this book Sharon and her daughter Cristy teach three methods: Turned Edge Appliqué, Raw Edge Appliqué, and Paperless Paper Piecing.

"Scarlet Serenade" had many big wins at major, national-level, quilt shows; taking Best of Show 2005 in Houston, and Best Longarm Quilting award at Pahducah. One block from that quilt is shown on the book cover. Sharon walks you through the making of this entire quilt, with step by step instructions and photos.

Save Your Quilts, Fold On The Bias by Ann Fahl

From the beginning of my quilting career in 1978, it troubled me that women would unwrap their precious quilts to share with others and that horrible center fold would mar the overall effect of the quilt because it was on the straight of the grain. These creases became a breast sticking out in the middle of the design that destroyed the appearance of their beautiful work.



Lay out the quilt on a table or flat surface. Fold the first corner into the middle.



Take the second corner and fold toward the middle.



Fold the third corner, notice that the corner goes past the edge



The third corner has been folded under.



The last corner has been folded up and anything that hangs over has been tucked in, just like before.


