




Always remember when using your own fabric all you need is...

27 " for the body, 9 " for the cuff, 2 1/2" for the accent, and a small strip about 7" long for the name tag.

Please don't forget the name tag, they are required!

Great Expectations left me flat. Printed in 1995, perhaps it is too old to be relevant now. It talks about the beginnings of some big quilt shows, gives a recipe or two, and has several quilt patterns.

"Blue Carpenter's Square" is perhaps the most unique quilt pattern. It uses strips sewn into stripes to make an interesting geometric quilt.

"Stars and Stripes" uses the Drunkard's Path block to make an interesting patriotic quilt. You would certainly learn the rights and wrongs of curved piecing here with 279 blocks to make. It would be a great patriotic quilt for 4th of July if anyone in Bakersfield really needs a quilt in July!

We have so many books in our library. Be sure to take a look at the red cart in the back of the room. Members may check books out on a monthly basis for free. There is definitely something for everybody.


