

Article V - Duties of Officers


We should make our deadline as May 27^{th} . Remember that the size is to be $3ft \times 5ft$, any color.



Book Review



Ruby Ollivier, a Charter Member and Honorary Life Member in 1986, passed away in April. A book in memory of Ruby was added to our library.






