Our own CeCe Westerfield will show us all of her secret tips for entering our quilts in the Ruby Jubilee! Hear about the exciting new categories! Learn what a judge looks for, how to make a sleeve for hanging and more! Don't miss this informative meeting for both display only, and judged quilts!



CeCe Westerfield "Quilting is my Passion and my Therapy"

CeCe learned to hand piece and hand guilt over 50 years ago from her maternal grandmother, an avid quilter. The tools of choice back then were scissors and cardboard templates.Up until 2000, she continued quilting, mostly utility quilts, when she could fit it in between raising three daughters and working full time. Then a quilt shop, 2 Quilt N'Sew, opened up in her neighborhood. She began taking classes, learning how to use those "new" tools, such as rotary cutters and rulers. Quilting by hand continued to be her favorite finishing method, but the piecing process became faster and more precise. One year before her retirement in 2009, CeCe purchased a longarm quilting machine. Now, instead of spending a year or more finishing a quilt by hand, she found that some guilts could be finished in days. Since then, she has entered her quilts in various quilt shows with some success. She has won awards both nationally and locally with her hand quilting and longarm quilting from quilt shows including MQX St. Louis, Road to CA, Best of the Valley, the Glendale Quilt Show, Pacific International Quilt Show and our own CPQ Quilt Show.

In addition to quilting, CeCe enjoys being a wife, mother and grandmother. She and her husband, Fraser, travel throughout the year and fly fishing is one of their favorite activities. And, yes, she takes her sewing machine plus hand work while traveling. She hopes that one or more of her grandchildren will also share her love of quilting.

Q: What does Ruby Jubilee mean?

A: We've been a guild for 40 years as of 2020, and the traditional gift for a 40th anniversary is ruby, so members, we are gifting you a "Ruby Jubilee" quilt show! Our goal is to have 40 vendors and 400 quilts for our 40th anniversary!

Q: Who is the instructor? I assume she is doing paper piecing?

A: Unfortunately, Stacey Day is unable to be with us, so our speaker is now known as "The DIY Addict", Karen Tripp! And yes, Karen will be teaching us English Paper Piecing ("EPP") and free paper piecing kits (fabric not included) will be handed out at the trunk show Friday night!

Q: What is the "Circle of Masters?"

A: We have 6 CPQ Master Quilters who will display their works of art representing our 40 years!

Q: What is the "Iron Lily?"

A: The Iron Lily is a brand new venue in Bakersfield not open yet. It's primarily for weddings and other big events. It's 12,000 feet of "quilty yumminess" just waiting for us!

Q: What is the cost?

A: Entry fee to cover both days is \$10.00. The Friday night trunk show, which will include a paper piecing kit, is \$12.00. There will be a class Saturday morning with the DIY Addict (Karen Tripp). Karen will be able to accommodate 30 people in her workshop. We will sell tickets to our members first, at the September meeting. The class will be \$60.00, BUT that will cover entry for both days, the Friday night trunk show (free EPP kit included) and the class Saturday! Parking is free.
