


NOVEMBER MEETING AND WORKSHOP

Pat Knoechel is a well known teacher and has taught at our guild in the past. This year, she will be explaining techniques to complete a block in the pattern, "Circle of Friends". The class will be held on Friday at Thimble Towne. This pattern can be made into a quilt, or a nice table runner. The pattern, which is required, is included in the class fee of \$40 (non-members \$50). You will also need the amazing "Double Square-up" ruler, which will be available to purchase for \$15 at the class. Circle of Friends is "layer cake" friendly. During the class, you will make the One Block wall hanging, or you can put 3 blocks together to make a table runner. Class will be held at Thimble Towne, and you may register online or at the October meeting.



Q: What does Ruby Jubilee mean?

A: We've been a guild for 40 years as of 2020, and the traditional gift for a 40th anniversary is ruby, so members, we are gifting you a "Ruby Jubilee" quilt show! Our goal is to have 40 vendors and 400 quilts for our 40th anniversary!

Q: Who is the instructor? I assume she is doing paper piecing?

A: Unfortunately, Stacey Day is unable to be with us, so our speaker is now known as "The DIY Addict", Karen Tripp! And yes, Karen will be teaching us English Paper Piecing ("EPP") and free paper piecing kits (fabric not included) will be handed out at the trunk show Friday night!

Q: What is the "Circle of Masters?"

A: We have 6 CPQ Master Quilters who will display their works of art representing our 40 years!

Q: What is the "Iron Lily?"

A: The Iron Lily is a brand new venue in Bakersfield not open yet. It's primarily for weddings and other big events. It's 12,000 feet of "quilty yumminess" just waiting for us!

Q: What is the cost?

A: Entry fee to cover both days is \$10.00. The Friday night trunk show, which will include a paper piecing kit, is \$12.00. There will be a class Saturday morning with the DIY Addict (Karen Tripp). Karen will be able to accommodate 30 people in her workshop. We will sell tickets to our members first, at the September meeting. The class will be \$60.00, BUT that will cover entry for both days, the Friday night trunk show (free EPP kit included) and the class Saturday! Parking is free.
